The deadlines to request extensions for existing students are the same as the nomination deadlines corresponding to the desired period.

Required documentation



It is necessary to send the following documentation to incoming@nebrija.es:

- Filled <u>Application form</u>
- Photocopy of passport
- Photocopy of transcript history of home university Studies
- Certificate of B2 level Spanish ability to Study subjects taught in Spanish, or similar B2 certificate in English for students who whish to take any classes taught in English. In both cases this is a requirement only for students who are non-native in these languages
- Photocopy of medical insurance valid in Spain.



Integrated Programmes



There are different Integrated Programs at Nebrija corresponding to each faculty of Nebrija University.

In this link you can consult each one of them and the different subjects that are taught.

Students are required to choose the subjects of degrees that are part of a single program.

To access the subjects taught in Spanish within these programs, a minimum level of Spanish of B2 is required (this requirement is exclusive for non-Spanish speaking students).

To access the courses taught in English within these programs, the home university must verify that the student has a minimum level of B2 in English.

Our international program is taught in-person, and therefore both lectures as well as exams (mid-terms, regular and re-take exams) require physicall presence at their corresponding campus and classrooms.

Students in Integrated Programmes are permitted to enroll in one semestre-long class of Spanish language courtesy of our Hispanic Studies Centre.



Hispanic Studies Programme





This programme consists of Language, Conversation, Culture and Literature courses offered at all levels, from beginners to native speakers.

The Programme is taught at our Princesa Campus or at a support building on Calle Vallehermoso, located approximately 5-10 minutes' walk away from the main campus.

To access this programme, no previous knowledge of Spanish is generally required.

Life in Madrid

Madrid is a vibrant and friendly city for international students.

Living costs can vary, but on average, it is estimated that a student needs around 900-1,200 euros per month to cover accommodation, food, transportation and personal expenses. Housing in student residences or rooming in student apartments can be more economical than living on your own.

In addition, there are student discounts for public transport, museums and cultural activities. It is important to plan a budget. Enjoy your experience in Madrid!

General Visa information:

If you are a European Union citizen, you do not need to apply for a visa. Students from other countries will have to apply for their student visa with the corresponding consulate months before your arrival in Spain.

Important: The Office of Internacional Mobility will not be responsible for delays in the processing of student visas.

Medical insurance:

All international students must have a valid medical insurance for the duration of their stay as a student.

If you are from the European Union, you can apply for the European Health Insurance Card, if your country does not belong to the European Union, you will have to look for a private medical insurance valid for student stays in the country of destination.
